*Trade Report for the Year 1871.*

EXPORTS.

THE exports from Siam in 1871, though less than the previous year, are still much above the average even of the last five years. The rice crop suffered considerably from want of sufficient rain; and though there was quite sufficient for home consumption, prices ruled high, and exportation was limited. We have also a strong competitor in the port of Saigon, which has some considerable advantages over us, as regards the export of rice to China. In the first place, its greater proximity admits of less freight, and consequently, when prices in both countries are the same, buyers will naturally prefer the nearer market. Secondly, she has now a telegraphic communication with Hong Kong, where the greater part of the speculators in the grain reside; and as they are thus better able to calculate their profits before chartering, they prefer sending their vessels to a port with which they are in daily communication, than to one from which they in all probability have no news for upwards of three weeks. Thirdly, they have got rid of the *corvée* system and thus all the inhabitants are free to work for themselves, which is not yet the case in Siam.

The attention of this Government has been repeatedly drawn to the want of telegraphic communication with the outside world, but as yet without much result. I believe, however, that this Government now intend to run a line from Bangkok to Penang; but I fear we shall not have the benefit of it for at least one year from this date.

In regard to the *corvée* system, the great evil of Siam, difficult as its abolishment will be, for the Government, as at present administered, could not be worked without it, still it is a mere question of time, when we shall be rid of it. All, or nearly all of those who, in the course of a very few years, will in all probability administer the Government of this country, are quite aware of its great evils, and are anxious to free their countrymen from the oppression, which is, and must be, the result of such a system. There is little doubt, that what most Europeans are pleased to call the inherent laziness of the Siamese, is merely the natural effect of making man-labour without any reward, or seeming benefit to himself. Numbers

of Siamese are now in the habit of compounding for the three months' labour due to their lords, and working with Europeans throughout the year. Those who had been for sometime under Europeans of energy and probity, work as hard, and are as regular in their conduct as the natives of any warm climate, and will do in one day as much work as an ordinary Siamese, working under the *corvée* system, will do in three. The Siamese officials are becoming so well aware of this fact, that many of them, when they have any real work to do, prefer to compound with the men told off to do it; and with the money thus obtained, hire labour at the market rates.

If, however, the export of rice does not continue to progress, and I doubt if it will, except in exceptionally productive years, until the labour of the country is freed from its present trammels, there are strong grounds for believing that our production of sugar will be largely extended. I have lately visited the Indo-Chinese Company's estate, and was much pleased with all I saw there. The steam-ploughs have turned out a great success, and have enabled the Company to get a large amount of land under cultivation, at less than half the rate they would have been obliged to pay, had they employed Chinese hand labour. From the deeper cultivation of these ploughs better crops are also expected, and an earlier planting of the cane is also expected. Up till now, the cane-growers have been in the habit of planting in March and April; and as the cane is cut in December and the three following months, it is barely ripe, and does not contain the same amount of saccharine matter that cane fully twelve months in the ground usually produces. The cane which the Company planted in December 1870, gave at least 10 per cent. when crushed in January, as against  $7\frac{1}{2}$  to 8 per cent. of the March planted cane. Though I believe the Company will find it much cheaper to grow their own cane, they have hitherto found no difficulty in purchasing as much from outsiders as they required. As they have dealt fairly with the growers, rates, which were formerly high, owing to the want of faith on the part of the Chinese sugar manufacturers, are now somewhat less, and may fairly be expected to be once more considerably lower than at present is the case.

#### IMPORTS.

The imports of this year are in excess of all previous years; but this merely arises from the fact that the entries have been more closely watched.
