FLAGS.

FEDERATED MALAY STATES.

The flag of the Federated Malay States is divided into four horizontal bands, of equal size, coloured white, red, yellow and black, in that order from the top downwards, and bears in the centre the badge of the Federation—viz., a springing tiger, on an oval white shield.

This flag is to be flown at the stern on all Federal Government vessels.

A small flag quartered diagonally with white above, yellow below, red next the staff and black outside, is to be flown at the bow as a Jack on all Federal Government vessels.

STATE OF PERAK.

The flag of the State of Perak is divided into three horizontal bands, of equal size, of the colours white, yellow and black, white being the uppermost and black the lowest, these three colours being the colours of the three great officers of the State, the Yang Di-pertuan, the Raja Muda and the Raja Bendahara, respectively.

The flag of His Highness the Sultan is a white ground with a representation of the State Flag in the upper corner next the staff.

The presence of the Sultan on board any Government vessel is to be denoted by his flag being flown at the fore and that of the British Resident by a Burgee at the fore in imitation of the State Flag.

The Union Jack is to be flown at the Residency from sunrise to sunset.

STATE OF SELANGOR.

The flag of the State of Selangor is red and yellow, quarterly, with a yellow crescent and star in canton. This flag is to be flown at the stern on all State Government vessels and from all State Government Signal Stations.

The flag of His Highness the Sultan of Selangor is a yellow ground with a yellow crescent and star in a red upper canton next the staff.

The presence of the Sultan on board any Government vessel is to be denoted by his flag being flown at the fore, and that of the British Resident by a Burgee at the fore in imitation of the State Flag.

FLAGS—(cont.)

A small flag quartered diagonally with red above and below, yellow next the staff and outside, is to be flown at the bow, as a Jack on all State vessels.

The Union Jack is to be flown at the Residency from sunrise to sunset.

STATE OF NEGRI SEMBILAN.

The Negri Sembilan flag is a yellow ground with red and black diagonal in canton. The colours are red for the Government, yellow for the Raja, and black for the Undang.

The presence of the Yang Di-pertuan on board any Government vessel is to be denoted by the Negri Sembilan Flag being flown at the fore, and that of the British Resident by a Burgee at the fore in imitation of the flag of the State.

A small flag two feet by one quartered diagonally with yellow above and below, red next to the staff and black outside is to be flown as a Jack at the bow of all State Government vessels.

The Union Jack is to be flown at the Residency from sunrise to sunset.

STATE OF PAHANG.

The flag of the State of Pahang is divided into two horizontal bands, of equal size; the upper part being white and the lower black. This flag is to be flown at the stern on all State Government vessels and from all State Government Signal Stations.

The flag of His Highness the Sultan of Pahang is white bearing in the centre a "chogan" head in yellow.

The presence of the Sultan on board any Government vessel is to be denoted by his flag being flown at the fore, and that of the British Resident by a Burgee at the fore in imitation of the State Flag.

A small flag quartered diagonally with white above and yellow, black next the staff and outside is to be flown at the bow as a Jack on all State vessels.

The Union Jack is to be flown at the Residency from sunrise to sunset.

SALUTES AND GUARDS OF HONOUR

(Gazette Notification No. 50 of 12th January, 1897.)

THE HIGH COMMISSIONER.

1. His Excellency the High Commissioner is to be received with a salute of seventeen guns, a guard of honour of fifty men, and a mounted escort when available on arrival at or departure from the capital of any of the Federated Malay States.

2. A guard of honour should be furnished whenever His Excellency visits the chief town of any district both on arrival and departure.

THE CHIEF SECRETARY TO GOVERNMENT.

3. The Chief Secretary to Government may receive a salute of fifteen guns on arrival in or departure from the capital of each State, once during the year, and a guard of honour of fifty men, and a mounted escort when available.

4. When visiting or passing through an out-station a guard of honour to be furnished only when asked for.

THE ADMIRAL OR GENERAL OFFICER COMMANDING.

5. The Admiral or General Officer Commanding on the station, if such officer arrives or leaves in uniform, is to be accorded a guard of honour of fifty men.

6. In every case the same ceremonies will be observed on departure as on arrival.

THE RULER OF THE STATE.

7. The Ruler of the State will receive a salute of seventeen guns on arrival in or departure from any Federated State, or the capital of his own State. His Highness will also receive a guard of honour of fifty men, and a mounted escort when available. A guard of honour should be furnished whenever His Highness visits any district, both on arrival and departure.

THE RESIDENT.

8. The Resident of any State may receive a salute of thirteen guns on arrival in or departure from the capital of his State, once a year, and a guard of honour of fifty men, and a mounted escort when available.

9. When visiting or passing through an out-station a guard of honour is to be furnished only when asked for.

OTHER OFFICERS.

10. No other local European officers, civil, naval or military (except under special instructions) receive any ceremonial reception.

WHITE UNDRESS TROPICAL UNIFORM.

(C.S.O. 3245/12, S. of S. 517/20, G. 1923/21, G. 2335/21 and G. 1613/31.)

A white undress tropical uniform has been approved for use at His Majesty's Court and on all ceremonial occasions overseas.

Only Governors-General, Governors, or High Commissioners may wear the first class of this uniform with which shall be worn a simple twisted gold cord shoulder strap. The other classes will be worn by persons who are entitled, or have received permission to wear the corresponding class of the ordinary civil uniform.

The adoption of the white undress uniform in any tropical Colony is left to the discretion of the Governor, but if once adopted, its use is compulsory on the occasions duly prescribed.

COAT.—White drill, with stand-up collar, having on it a detachable gorget of gold braid on a blue ground, varying in pattern according to rank as prescribed, viz.:

Class I and II:

Length, 5 inches; breadth, 1³/₄ inches; Oak-leaf pattern; one button on point.

Class III and IV:

Length, 4 inches; breadth, $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches; Oak-leaf pattern; one button on point.

Class V:

Length, $3\frac{1}{5}$ inches; breadth, $\frac{3}{5}$ inch; two gold bands, each $2\frac{1}{4}$ inches in length and $\frac{1}{5}$ inch in breadth; one button on point.

BUTTONS.—Gilt mounted, the Royal Arms with supporters, in the case of the first and second classes. The buttons to be worn with the other three classes of uniform should be gilt mounted, the Royal Arms (without supporters) surmounted by the Imperial Crown. Number of buttons on cuffs of coat: first and second classes, three; third and fourth classes, two; fifth, one.

TROUSERS .- White drill. No lace.

Boors.—Black patent leather. White shoes (lace-up, of white buckskin, without toe-caps) may be worn instead of black boots if specially ordered by the Governor. When the uniform is worn mounted, black or brown knee boots, with white or dark blue pantaloons, at the discretion of the Governor. Straight-necked steel hunting spurs.

WHITE UNDRESS TROPICAL UNIFORM-(cont.)

HELMET.—White, of the Wolseley pattern, bearing in front a gilt badge, the Royal Arms with supporters. A Governor may wear with this uniform a plumed helmet, having a plume similar to that on the cocked hat worn with the Governor's special uniform.*

SWORD.—The usual civil sword, the frog and scabbard underneath the coat, the hilt appearing through a slit in the side of the coat.

MEDALS AND DECORATIONS.—Full size medals and decorations (including the riband of a Knight Grand Cross) will be worn with this uniform.

THE LAND CODE, 1926.

PREMIA AND RENTS.

16. The rates of premium and rent set out in the following rules will Land Rules, 1980. be the rates charged upon all lands alienated after the coming into force of these rules, but subject to the provisions contained in rules G. 6916, 11-10-29. 18 and 25 nothing herein contained shall preclude the Resident from G. 3414, 14-5-30. fixing higher or lower rates in particular cases as he may think fit.

TOWN AND VILLAGE LOTS AND LANDS.

17. (i) Land comprised within the boundaries of a town or village, G. 6916, 11-10-29. will normally be alienated by auction, subject to a reserve price fixed by the Resident. Such reserve price will be in lieu of premium and will be inclusive of all fees for survey, boundary stones and preparation and registration of title.

(ii) Where such land is not alienated by auction, the premium payable in addition to the fees for survey, boundary stones and the preparation and registration of title, will be fixed by the Resident.

18. The annual rent on town or village lots and land will be at such rates as may be fixed by the Resident in each particular case provided that in no case shall they be less than the following:

46. (i) The Resident may authorise the officer for the time being having the control and maintenance of any land reserved for a public purpose to issue licences for the temporary occupation of parts of such land not exceeding one acre in extent and to fix the fees to be paid for such licences.

(ii) The period of any such licence may not exceed one year.

LICENCES TO REMOVE SAND, ETC.

TRADE AND CUSTOMS.

THE CUSTOMS ENACTMENT, 1923.

Section 16, Warehouse Licence.-There shall be charged for every such licence an annual fee to be determined by the Chief Secretary in each case.

EXPORT PROHIBITION.

The Chief Secretary to Government hereby prohibits the exporta- G. 6096, 26-9-23. tion from the Federated Malay States of the articles mentioned in the schedule hereto except under and in accordance with a licence granted in that behalf.

DAYS AND HOURS DURING WHICH COLLECTION STATIONS MAY BE OPEN FOR BUSINESS AND THE HOURS DURING WHICH GOODS MAY BE LANDED OR SHIPPED AND CON-CERNING THE PAYMENT OF OVERTIME FEES.

5. (i) The ordinary office hours of the Customs Offices and Warehouses shall be as follows :

Week-days other than Saturdays ... 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Saturdays 8 a.m. to 12 noon

(ii) On Sundays and notified holidays Customs Offices and Warehouses may be closed throughout the day.

6. Customs Offices and Warehouses may be opened and goods may be landed or loaded at other than the ordinary hours in accordance with the particulars set forth in the schedule hereto and upon • payment of overtime fees at the prescribed rates by such person or persons and in such proportions as are set forth in the said schedule.

7. Where a Government department desires a Customs Office or Warehouse to be opened or to land or load goods at other than the ordinary hours reasonable notice as laid down by departmental regulations shall be given beforehand to the Proper Officer of Customs concerned. In all other cases the importer or exporter or his agent or the master or agent of any vessel in port as the case may be or where a vessel is not in port and it is desired to load or land goods, the agent of the vessel concerned, shall give notice in writing before the close of the ordinary working hour immediately preceding the time when it is desired to have the Customs Office or Warehouse open or to land or load goods. On failure to give such notice the Proper Officer of Customs shall have a discretion as to permitting the opening of the Customs Office or Warehouse or the landing or loading of goods or otherwise.

Always provided that:

- (a) In the exercise of such discretion the Proper Officer of Customs shall, as far as may be practicable, endeavour to meet the convenience of the public.
- (b) No goods shall be landed or shipped between the hours of 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. except with the special permission of the Proper Officer of Customs.
- (c) Ice and fresh fish may be landed at any time.

8. All overtime fees payable under these rules and the schedule hereto shall be paid into the public revenue and all overtime fees earned by Customs Officers or employees shall be deemed to be moneys due to them and payable from the public revenue in accordance with such departmental regulations as may from time to time be made.

9. No Customs Officer, clerk, peon, watchman, employee or *G.* 5618. 14-9-28. labourer shall be deemed to have a claim against the public revenue for overtime fees in respect of work done in other than the ordinary hours unless he has worked for more hours than the normal number as fixed by the departmental regulations.

10. Where overtime fees are payable in accordance with the schedule hereunder the following scale of fees for overtime allowances shall be paid into the public revenue in respect of the services of each Customs Officer, clerk, peon, watchman or labourer, who shall be required to work beyond the ordinary hours at the request of the master or agent of a vessel in port, or of an importer or exporter. Such scale of fees shall also apply where overtime fees are expressly stated in the schedule hereto to be payable by Government and not by the public.

11. In calculating overtime periods, no account shall be taken of fractions of an hour not exceeding fifteen minutes. Fractions of an hour exceeding fifteen minutes shall count as one hour.

No fee shall be charged for the issue of such permit.

No person shall import tobacco direct into any district in the Federated Malay States otherwise than through the Post Office except under and in accordance with a licence issued in that behalf, provided that tobacco intended for private consumption only may be imported without licence if imported

(b) as part of personal baggage

provided that the quantity of tobacco so imported at any one time shall not exceed 10 lbs. in weight.

RULES made by the Judicial Commissioners, with the approval of the Chief Secretary to Government, under section 12 of "The Court Fees Enactment, 1905," for regulating the mode in which fees chargeable under that Enactment shall be collected and for ensuring the proper cancellation of judicial stamps and for keeping accounts of such stamps.

1. The fees to be taken in the Supreme Court and the Courts of Magistrates shall be taken by adhesive stamps.

2. The adhesive stamps at present in use in these Courts shall continue to be used so long as they are supplied by the Treasury.

3. The stamps shall be affixed to a præcipe in the form in the schedule hereto.

4. Before the document to which any stamp relates is sealed or the præcipe in any way acted upon such stamp shall be cancelled by the officer of the Court charged with that duty.

5. The cancellation shall be effected by defacing the stamp in indelible ink by a hand stamp bearing the word "cancelled" and the date of cancelling as well as by means of perforation and it shall be obligatory on all officers of the Supreme Court and the Magistrates' Courts charged with the duty of cancelling adhesive stamps to see that all stamps affixed to præcipes are so cancelled on the presentation thereof.

6. The officer charged with the duty of cancelling the stamps shall enter in a book kept for that purpose a record of the value of the stamps so cancelled by him together with the nature of the document in respect of which the fee denoted by the stamps is chargeable and the number of the suit or matter in which it is required to be sealed.

7. Every document sealed in pursuance of a præcipe shall bear an endorsement signed by the officer cancelling the stamps giving the reference number to the præcipe and stating that the fee chargeable on it has been paid by stamps.

8. The præcipes shall be kept on a file and numbered in consecutive order until the audit is taken and each præcipe shall bear the number of the suit to which it pertains. After the lapse of six months from the date on which the Audit Officer shall have certified his satisfaction with his examination of the accounts of the fees received by stamps in the record kept of the value of stamps cancelled in the Registry, the præcipes dealt with under the audit shall be destroyed in the presence of the Registrar and the Audit Officer.

When a witness uses his own motor car, and it is desirable or reasonable having regard to all the circumstances that he should do so, mileage at 20 cents a mile may be paid. A journey between two places is considered for the purpose of calculating travelling expenses or mileage, as performed by the short-est practicable route, or by the cheapest of such routes as may be equally short. The shortest route is that by which the traveller can most speedily reach his destination by the ordinary modes of travelling. If a person travels by a route which is not the shortest, but which is cheaper than the shortest, his expenses will be calculated as those of the route by which he actually travelled.

4. The above scale does not apply to Government officers. All Government officers (including policemen, kathis, school masters and railway officials) are to be paid travelling allowances in accordance with General Orders. When a Government officer loses his Government pay by reason of his having to attend Court as a witness, he may be paid according to the above scale.

5. Any witness being a Doctor, Banker, Engineer, Surveyor, Architect, Accountant or other professional man, may be paid, on the certificate of a Registrar or of a Magistrate, for attending to give evidence in his professional capacity but not otherwise, a fee, in addition to any other compensation or expenses payable to him under these rules, which shall not exceed \$10 in respect of evidence given in the Court of a Magistrate nor \$20 in respect of evidence given in the Supreme Court. This rule does not apply to Government officers.

Provided that nothing in these rules contained shall be construed to prevent the Public Prosecutor in any case from making a contract with any expert to give evidence which may require previous attainment work, study, research or preparation on his part.

6. Regard should be had to the amount of time during which a witness was giving evidence or was obliged to attend Court, or was compelled to travel, and was therefore absent from his ordinary occupations, in calculating the fees and allowances payable between the limits fixed.

- (a) all property belonging to one person sold by an auctioneer G. 4581, 5-7-29. under any one order of Court shall be deemed to be the subject of one sale; provided that where in such case the property consists partly of movable and partly of immovable property the movable and immovable property respectively shall be deemed to be the subject of two separate sales.
- (b) Where property is sold subject to a charge or mortgage the principal and interest due on such charge or mortgage shall be added to the gross amount realised by the sale for the purpose of calculating the percentage commission.

3. (a) Where the order for sale by public auction is cancelled or the sale is postponed by order of Court before the completion of the sale the remuneration of the auctioneer shall be at the discretion of the taxing officer.

(b) Where property is put up for sale by public auction but no sale takes place by reason of the reserve price not being reached the auctioneer shall receive half the commission which would have been payable under rule 1 calculated on such reserve price; provided that where at one sale the reserve price on some lots is reached and the reserve price on the other lots is not reached the sale price of the lots sold shall be aggregated with the reserve price of the lots unsold and the rate of commission on both the lots sold and the lots unsold shall be based on the total of such sale and reserve prices so aggregated.

(c) Where, either before or after property has been advertised for sale, a sale, negotiated by the auctioneer, is approved by the Court, the auctioneer shall receive commission on the gross amount realised by such private sale as though it had been a sale by public auction.

4. The scales of commission in rule 1 shall cover all remuneration or charges of the auctioneer other than actual out-of-pocket expenses which shall be taxed according to the following scale:

SCALE OF CHARGES FOR MEDICINES SOLD AT GOVERNMENT HOSPITALS AND DISPENSABIES.

The sale of medicines at Government hospitals and dispensaries will be on the following scale, but Medical Officers may, at their discretion, reduce these charges or forego them altogether in the case of very poor patients.

2. Medicines will only be dispensed upon payment in cash as a rule but a letter of guarantee for payment may be accepted when for any reasonable cause it is impossible for the out-patient to make payment at the time.

3. On Sundays and public holidays, prescriptions should be sent between the hours of 8 and 9 a.m. They will not be dispensed at any other time unless marked "urgent" by a Medical Officer.

4. When it is not possible to apply any particular prescription to the sub-joined scale, cost price plus 25 per cent. for all drugs dispensed with a minimum charge of 20 cents for each prescription, will be charged.

5. All previous scales of charges for medicines are hereby cancelled.

6. There should be no charge for quinine itself but a dispensing fee should be charged for plain quinine mixtures and capsules.

Upon approval of any application the applicant will be informed that the sanatorium is provisionally reserved for him for a stated period, whereupon he should forward, without delay, a cheque for the amount chargeable for rent in respect of that period together with the deposit of \$20. On receipt of this payment the reservation will be confirmed and a permit issued. In the event of the rent charge and deposit not being received within ten days of the date of posting of notification of provisional reservation the latter will be cancelled.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Permits.—All applications for permits to occupy must be addressed 6. 6476, 29.8-39. in writing to the Lady Supervisor of Bungalows, Port Dickson. Permits for the occupation of any of these bungalows for a term of not exceeding fourteen days, in the first instance, may be obtained by persons of the following classes:

- (a) Officers in the service of the Federated Malay States, G. 3408, 10-5-29. Unfederated Malay States, or the Colony, and resident in the Federated Malay States, and Naval, Military and Air Officers serving in the Federated Malay States, Unfederated Malay States, or the Colony :
 - Provided that no bungalow shall be occupied by Naval, Military and Air Officers in the aggregate for more than 60 days in any one year.
- (b) Officers in the service of the Federated Malay States, the Unfederated Malay States, or the Colony, and not resident in the Federated Malay States, and Officers in the Federated Malay States Railways.
- (c) Private residents and visitors.

Applications for the use of such bungalows will be received as follows:

- (i) From persons in class (a) within two months of the date from which occupation is to commence.
- (ii) From persons in class (b) within six weeks of the date from which occupation is to commence.
- (iii) From persons in class (c) within one month of the date from which occupation is to commence.
 - Priority will usually be given to applications from persons in classes (a) and (b) made on the grounds of ill-health if supported by a medical certificate.

These bungalows are available for Government servants drawing salaries of not less than \$400 per mensem. In the absence of an application from any such persons, a bungalow may be allotted to other Government servants or to private persons at the discretion of the District Officer.

The rates for persons in class (c) shall be twice the above rates.

When an application is made for a bungalow, the Lady Supervisor of Bungalows, with the approval of the District Officer, will notify the applicant of the accommodation available, and the rent if any, payable. If such accommodation is accepted, the rent for the whole period must be paid in advance within seven days of the receipt of this notification. The District Officer will then issue a permit to occupy. All permits are strictly non-transferable. Rent will only be refunded provided a permit holder surrenders the permit in sufficient time to admit of the bungalow being relet, and then only in respect of the period during which it is relet.

No persons in class (a) or (b) shall be resident continuously in a bungalow for more than 21 days at any one time without special permission and no person in class (c) shall occupy a bungalow for more than fourteen days at any one time without such permission.

Servants.—All bungalows are provided with a caretaker and a water-carrier. Visitors are advised to bring their own boys if a party of four or more is contemplated; otherwise a charge of 50 cents a day will be made.

Catering.—The caretaker will cook for visitors who wish to cater for themselves or will supply food on contract for all meals including early morning tea at the following rates per person.

RULES FOR "TAMAN SERI," THE MALAY OFFICERS' BUNGALOW AT G. 1010, 17-2-28. Port Dickson.—

1. The Bungalow is a semi-detached building, providing accommodation for two families.

2. PERMITS.—All applications for permits to occupy must be addressed to the District Officer, Port Dickson. Permits for occupation of either wing, for a period not exceeding 14 days in the first instance may be issued to Malay officers of the following classes only:

Malayan Civil Service;

Administrative Branch (excluding Probationers);

Malay Assistant Commissioners of Police;

Malay Probationary Assistant Commissioners of Police;

Malay Chief Inspectors of Police;

Malay Inspectors of Police (excluding Probationers);

Junior Agricultural Assistants (excluding those under \$120 p.m.);

Senior Agricultural Assistants and higher posts in Agricultural Department;

Junior Malay Co-operative Officers (excluding those under \$120 p.m.);

Malay Co-operative Officers;

Senior Malay Co-operative Officers;

Malay Assistant Inspectors of Schools, Grades I and II;

Malay Teachers, Vernacular Schools, Special Class;

Assistant Medical Officers;

Assistant Surgeons;

Dressers, Special Grade and Grade I.

Applicants should state the appointment they hold, and may apply not more than two months prior to the date on which they require accommodation. Priority will be given to applications made on the grounds of ill-health if supported by a medical certificate.

3. SERVANTS.—A caretaker and a water-carrier are provided. Occupants are requested to make their own arrangements for catering.

4. CHARGES.—No rent is payable. The caretaker is authorised to make a service charge of \$1 a day or part of a day for each wing occupied, to cover the cost of laundry, firewood, lighting, etc.

5. MISCELLANEOUS.—The Bungalow is fully furnished with plate, bed and table-linen, mosquito nets, etc.

6. Visitors are held responsible for all damage done to the bungalow or its fittings: all breakages of crockery, glasses, etc., must be paid for to the caretaker before visitors leave the Bungalow. The caretaker is responsible for the collection of these sums: he is provided with a tariff showing the cost of various items. Visitors are requested to exercise care and consideration towards the furniture in the Bungalow which is fitted up and maintained at considerable expense. Under no circumstances are cushions and chairs to be taken out of the Bungalow.

7. The District Officer may, with the approval of the British Resident of Negri Sembilan, decline to issue a permit to any person without giving any reason.

G. 3517, 3-5-31. RULES FOR THE PORT DICKSON SANATORIA FOR MEMBERS OF THE SUBORDINATE SERVICES, FEDERATED MALAY STATES.—

1. These rules apply to the following bungalows:

- (a) PORTSDOWN—Accommodation, two double bed-rooms;
- (b) SANDOWN—Accommodation, three double bed-rooms;
- (c) KINGSDOWN-Accommodation, two double bed-rooms.

These three bungalows are $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Port Dickson and are by the sea-side.

2. These bungalows are available for all members of the subordinate services of the Federated Malay States Government drawing a substantive salary of not less than \$60 per mensem. Those who are eligible for "Taman Seri" bungalow and employees of the Federated Malay States Railways shall not be eligible to occupy them.

3. Ordinarily, the maximum period of occupation shall be 14 days in a calendar year and this period shall not be exceeded except under very special circumstances.

4. All applications for permits to occupy shall be addressed in writing to the Lady Supervisor of Government Bungalows, Port Dickson, stating in which bungalow accommodation is desired and for what period, and the salary and appointment of the applicant.

5. No application will be considered if received more than two months before the date on which accommodation is desired and applications for "Portsdown" bungalow which are not supported by a medical certificate will not be entertained more than 14 days before the commencement of the period applied for. "Portsdown" bungalow will not be allotted if accommodation is available in the other bungalows. Priority will be given generally to applications supported by a medical certificate.

All permits are strictly non-transferable.

If the accommodation reserved is not wanted by the person to whom the bungalow has been allotted, he must return the permit to the Lady Supervisor of Government Bungalows, Port Dickson, with as little delay as possible. Failure to do so will render the applicant liable to lose the privilege of future allotment.

6. The three bungalows are provided with a caretaker, two water carriers and a gardener.

Visitors are advised to bring their own servants if a large party is contemplated.

Visitors must make their own arrangements for food for themselves and their servants.

MISCELLANEOUS.

7. The bungalows are fully furnished with plate, bed and table linen and mosquito nets, etc.

Visitors are held responsible for all damage done to the bungalows or the fittings. They are requested to exercise care and consideration towards the furniture in the bungalows which are maintained at considerable expense. Under no circumstances should cushions and chairs be taken out of the bungalows. All breakages of crockery, glasses, etc., must be paid for to the caretaker before visitors leave the bungalows. He is provided with a list showing the cost of the various items.

8. Visitors are requested to enter in the book provided for the purpose the time and date of arrival and departure, their names and addresses, the permit number, and any charges paid to the caretaker.

The Lady Supervisor of Government Bungalows is in charge of all the bungalows and is responsible for the discipline, etc., of servants. All cases of incivility or inattention should be communicated to her (Telephone No. 50).

9. There is a bathing pagar for the use of the visitors.

10. Music, singing, and all noise after 10 p.m. is forbidden.

11. Visitors shall on no account keep dogs in these bungalows.

12. The District Officer may decline to issue a permit to any person without assigning any reason.

RULES FOR THE PORT DICKSON REST-HOUSE.

The rules for Government rest-houses shall be applicable to the Port Dickson rest-house subject to the following modifications:

1. Rooms 1, 2, 3, and 4 may be occupied by Government officers, in receipt of salaries of not less than \$100 a month, and by *bona fide* travellers. Government officers travelling on duty shall have prior claim for accommodation.

2. Visitors, other than Government officers travelling on duty, shall pay \$2 per room per night.

3. Rooms, if available, may be occupied during the day for a period not exceeding 6 hours at a charge of 50 cents each.

4. Rooms 5 and 6 are available for the use of Government officers drawing salaries of not less than \$3,000 per annum and of other suitable applicants. Occupation of rooms 5 and 6 shall be by permit only. Applications should be addressed to the District Officer, Port Dickson. Permits will be issued with effect from noon to noon. Priority will be given to:

- (a) Applications by Government officers on duty;
- (b) , made on the grounds of ill-health if supported by a medical certificate.

5. No person may occupy room 5 or 6 for more than fourteen days except with special permission.

GENERAL.

6. The Caretaker will supply meals and liquor in accordance with a tariff approved by the District Officer and posted in the rest-house.

7. Visitors are held responsible for all damage to the buildings or grounds by themselves or their servants. All breakages must be paid for to the Caretaker before visitors leave the rest-house.

8. The Caretaker is responsible for the collection of these sums and is provided with a tariff showing the cost of various items.

9. A book is kept in the rest-house in which visitors are requested to enter the times of their arrival and departure and the charges paid to the Caretaker. A separate entry should be made for each room occupied.

10. A book for suggestions and complaints is kept in the rest-house.

11. A child's cot is provided in the rest-house.

12. The District Officer, Port Dickson, may decline to issue a permit to any person without giving any reason.

- (b) For a distance exceeding 10 miles, 7 cents per mile for the first 10 miles and 6 cents per mile or part of a mile thereafter.

2. Where the whole car is engaged at a maximum fare of 20 cents per mile or part of a mile, the hirer to pay for the return journey to the place of hiring at the same rate except at the following places where cars may be discharged without such liability: Raub, Kuala Lipis, Tras, Bentong, Kuala Kubu, Mentakab, Temerloh, Jerantut and Kuantan.

3. For every hour of detention (up to 10 hours) a charge not exceeding 10 cents per passenger accommodation for every hour or part of an hour after the first fifteen minutes with a maximum charge of \$10 for any period up to 24 hours.


